
I would like to thank all the 49 players that played in our Royal City Ringers Horseshoe club at some point this year.



- 5. Bulletin board for posting game results.
- 6. Dry place to set up computer with electrical outlets.
- 7. Tables to set up Horseshoe Ontario Related Items.
- 8. Place to lock up computer and Horseshoe ON Games Related Items at night.
- 9. Added prize money (except deposit) in cash by Friday afternoon.
- 10. Supply food and bar.

In Memory of Mike Ryde June 13, 1944 - July 29, 2023

Mike joined our club in 1999 and in 2002 was elected Vice-President which he served until 2021. In 2022 elected to the executive committee 2022 - 2023. During his time on the executive, he had the dual role as Project Manager.

Ken Condie "said "I had the vision of what was needed at the park, Mike had the knowledge and background in construction to make it happen.

In 2003 he designed and sourced out the blocks for our much-needed storage building (clubhouse), in 2007 we built two shelters, serving pits 1 to 7. Before the construction he spent hours drawing up the plans for the structures and meetings with city officials, going over drawings for approval. We started April 28 to dig and form for the concrete. On May 7^{th,} we arranged for the use of one of their buildings to prefabricate the beams and trusses for the shelters, we worked at night, with Mike overseeing the work as well as hands on. June 13th during construction Mike's wife Cathy brought a birthday cake to celebrate his 63rd birthday. In 2011 shelter number 3, was built for pits 8 to 12. In 2016 Mike designed and helped build our barbeque shelter and reenforced it in 2017.

In 2012 we proposed to city officials about re-designing the courts, with concrete walkways and red stones between pits, which we were prepared to do all the work if they would supply the cement. After several meetings, we were surprised to hear that they would have a contractor do all the work, if we would supervise the construction. That was right up Mike's expertise, he had the drawings ready and in the final steps, measured the first pit and found it was not to specs by one inch, which was corrected, and the rest went to plans. Mike and Ken spent 14-hour days at the park for several weeks, our wives said we should put beds in the clubhouse. For his contribution and dedication, he was presented the Presidents award in 2006, 2007 and 2012.

After a successful bid to host the 2019 Canadian Singles Horseshoe Pitching championships, Mike was the mastermind of the whole event, and it will go down in history of one of the most successful.

Before he passed away, he was notified that his drawings for the new to be build roof over the viewing stands were approved and construction would begin this fall.

To really appreciate his contribution to the club, go to our website and look up the years mentioned above.

His personal record in the club he won many 1st, 2^{nd,} and 3rd place finishes, won his division in the 2000, 2015 Ontario singles division and the Canadian Singles championship in 2015, 2018. He started off with a 19.7% and maintained an average in the mid twenty's, in 2018 (age 74) with his body unable to compete at the 40 ft. distance, he moved up to pitching at 30 ft. and his average that year was 34.2%.

Mike lived and breathed our club motto: Fellowship – Sportsmanship – Friendly Competition, you left your mark on our club and everyone you touched. "Gone But Never Forgotten"

Rest in peace brother you earned it.
